**STATEWIDE SINGLE AUDIT**  
**FY 2018 Audit – For the Year Ending August 31, 2018**

Texas A&M University, a State of Texas agency, is included as part of the Statewide comprehensive annual financial report audit and Statewide Single Audit, performed each year by the State Auditor's Office in Texas. **The State of Texas fiscal year is September 1 through August 31.**

The State Auditor's Office and KPMG, LLP performed the federal portion (website link is <https://www.sao.texas.gov/Reports/Main/19-315.pdf>) of the 2018 Statewide Single Audit (formerly A-133). The federal portion included a review of compliance and controls over the State's federal awards and an audit of the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA). The reports from the federal portion and the financial portion are submitted to the federal government to fulfill Single Audit reporting requirements.

**Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) – State of Texas**

Annual financial reports are the responsibility of the Chief Business Officer. Texas A&M University's financial activities for each fiscal year are part of the statewide CAFR (Comprehensive Annual Financial Report) coordinated by the State Comptroller's Office.

### **R&D Cluster**

For Texas A&M University (which also includes the Health Science Center and branch campus at Galveston), the FY 2018 report had 3 findings classified as “significant deficiency and non-compliance and” and one finding classified as “significant deficiency.” (*Note: A significant deficiency indicates control weaknesses, but those weaknesses would not likely result in material non-compliance. They are a private non-profit foundation that administers federal and other sponsored grants or contracts on behalf of Texas A&M University and other System parts. The Texas A&M Research Foundation has a Single Audit (A-133) each year by an external audit firm.*

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
