Guidelines

In one continuous document, upload the following three items:

1. Proposal. **NOTE: The proposal must not exceed 5 double-spaced pages in Time New Roman 11-point font.** One additional page may be included for images, musical scores or other non-text supporting materials.
2. Bibliography (1 single-spaced page),
3. Resume (up to 2 single-spaced pages).

The proposal must provide an intellectual justification of your project and include the following three components:

- a. A brief overview of the basic ideas, problems, or questions addressed by the project.
- b. A description of the intellectual significance of the proposed project, the potential to advance the field of study and the benefits to the general community.
- c. A description of your methods, the current state of the project, and what part or stage of the project will be supported by the fellowship. Indicate what will be accomplished during each year of the award.
- d. An explanation of how your expertise or background prepares you for the area of inquiry and the execution of the work within the proposed time frame.
